You should nominate two referees (academic, industry or government) to support your submission.

Your abstract/proposed presentation should clearly identify one of the four research areas of interest (as per Network node structure) :

1. Coastal settlements
2. Urban management, transport and inclusion
3. Built environment, innovation, institutional reform
4. Infrastructure
