Project Overview

- In partnership with the ACT Government, the research team of six includes a GIS specialist, ANU senior research fellow, and PhD's working as RA's
- "Retrofitting and revitalising low density suburbs and town centres for long term sustainability"
- Mixed methods approach GIS, qualitative interviews, and desktop analysis
- Using the ACT's most southern residential district as the case study (Tuggeranong)

Tuggeranong District

Population: 86,000

Total suburbs: 19

Though settled for rural purposes previously, the first suburb of Kambah was completed in the early 1970's

Lake Tuggeranong was purpose built in the late 1980's, neighbouring the town centre

Occupied by the Ngunnawal peoples for over 21,000 years

Urban development in Tuggeranong can be categorised as low density, residential suburban living of relatively older housing stock in most areas



Stage 1: Understanding Tuggeranong

- GIS data analysis (ABS and SEIFA datasets)
- Mapping the following key attributes:
 - Demographic Profile
 - Dwellings and Land use
 - Social and Economic Analysis
 - Population and Residential Density
 - Employment & Transport Analysis
- Grounded by interviews with community leaders and representatives
- Stage 2 commencing in March focus groups with residents






